About Kuttikkanam



Kuttikkanam is a village held in the lap of Sahayadri Mountain Ghats in Idukki district, Kerala, Southern India at an altitude of 3,500 feet (1,100 m) above sea level. It is within the territory of Peermade.

In Malayalam, '*Kutti*' means '*Small*' and '*kanam*' means '*woods*'. The plants in this place will not grow very tall as the winds will not allow the plants to grow tall. So the hills are covered with short trees and plants. Due to this reason, the place received the name '*Kuttikkanam*'.

The green contours carved against the heavenly clouds in Kuttikkanam showcase God's tranquil magnificence. The lush green tea plantations, high peaks, silvering cascades and pathless woods exhibit the charm of Kuttikkanam in its own unique way.

Important Tourist Places

(near to Kuttikkanam)

- **Peeru Hills** : This idyllic hill station is a favourite haunt of trekkers and picnickers. The hill is named after Peer Mohammed, the Sufi saint, who spent his last days here. The mausoleum of the saint, the summer palace of the royal family and the residence of the Diwan situated nearby are all worth a visit.
- **Grampi**: Commonly known as Parunthupara, a rock sculpture about 150 ft (46 m) high and about 3,800 feet (1,200 m) above sea level.
- **Thottapura**: The place where the Travancore royal family stored weapons.
- **Baker Hills** (Commercially Named to Thrisangu Hills): Rolling hills with views.
- **Panchalimedu**: A viewpoint, according to legend one of the many hiding places of the Pandavas and Panchali. From a pond known as Panchalikkulam ,the "Makarajyothi"(the divine flame lit during the pilgrimage season in Sabarimala) can be seen.
- **Valanjanganam Waterfalls**: A main attraction of Kuttikkanam, also known as Ninnumullippara. The waterfall is about 75 ft (23 m) in height and is usually covered in mist.
- **Nallathanni viewpoint**: On the Kottayam-Kumily State Highway.
- **Artificial forest**: A dense pine forest covering 100 acres (0.40 km²). Contains an estimated 30 species of birds, including rare endangered species. It is classified as a buffer zone by the Kerala state forestry department.
- **Azhutha Diversion Project**: A project constructed by the Kerala government on the Azutha river, diverting water to Idukki Reservoir through a 987 m long tunnel.
