Action Taken Report (ATR) on Curriculum

A structured (rating-based) feedback form, designed by IQAC feedback committee, is circulated among stakeholders such as Students, Teachers, Alumni, and Industry experts by the department to get their suggestions with regard to the quality of the curriculum. 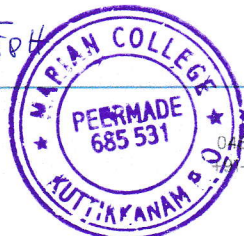
