## ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021

### INTRODUCTION

The academic schedule of all educational institutions in India got disrupted due to the outbreak of Covid 19 pandemic and the consequent restrictions imposed due to nationwide lock down. Marian College Kuttikkanam made all possible efforts to protect the interests of students by ensuring the completion of the academic assessments of students at the earliest possible time. Following are some of the initiatives taken by the College to ensure timely completion of assessments.

- Semester Examinations of Fifth and Third Semester UG and Third Semester PG were held in various centres across the state. November 2020 examinations were held in the month of December when the restrictions imposed by Covid -19 eased. Students were given the option to choose centres for writing the examinations.

## Automation initiatives

The integration of all the activities of the College through a single software named **mcka** gathered momentum during this academic year and the following services/ provisions were made in the software.

- Barcoding of answer books was introduced.
- Partial automation of paper valuation was executed during this year. Based on the question paper generated for a course, unique template for mark entry was generated and examiners were given the provision for direct entry of marks to the portal.
- Answer books are assigned to evaluators through the software.
- To facilitate outcome assessment in semester end examinations changes were made in the question pattern and bouquet model was introduced.
- Provisions were made to integrate all payments to the College through *mcka.in*

### Setting of Question Papers

All question papers for semester end examinations were generated through the software mcka.in. The teachers in charge of each course were entrusted with the task of preparing question banks for each course. To ensure quality of the question bank they were subjected to peer vetting by faculty members who has expertise in the discipline. To further ensure quality check in questions intended to assess outcomes through semester end examinations, buddy system was introduced. The vetting process ensured that the question bank adhered to the norms set for preparation of questions. The following are the norms set by the College for question bank.

- The question bank should uniformly cover entire syllabus prescribed for the course.
- An average student could easily understand the meaning of the questions.
- There should not be any typographical and grammatical errors.
- There should be a mix of questions from different taxonomy levels.
- Question Bank should ensure a mix of easy, moderate and challenging questions.

The teachers entrusted with vetting of the question bank were asked to give a general comment on the quality of the question bank. Moreover they were asked to give a feedback on any specific questions which required improvement/modification.

### Moderation/Grace mark Boards and decisions

During this academic year moderation was not awarded to any of the students in the College. Grace marks were awarded to deserving students on the basis of the recommendation of the Examination Committee

### Details of malpractices during examinations

5 cases of malpractices were reported during this academic year. Based on the gravity of the offence due punishments were recommended by the MPC and those recommendations were effected without any change by the office of the Controller of Examinations.

## Appointment of Observers/Squad

Dr Sabu Augustine was entrusted with the task of coordinating and conducting periodic inspection of examination halls to prevent malpractices and to augment monitoring system of semester end examinations.

## Evaluation of Answer Sheets

Evaluation of answer scripts was conducted in valuation camps held in the College in which duly appointed faculty members participated. The answer books were assigned to faculty members through the mcka portal and provision was made to directly enter the marks. This innovation was found helpful in eliminating mistakes which may creep in at the data entry stage. Moreover this facilitated outcome assessment in Semester End Assessment.
