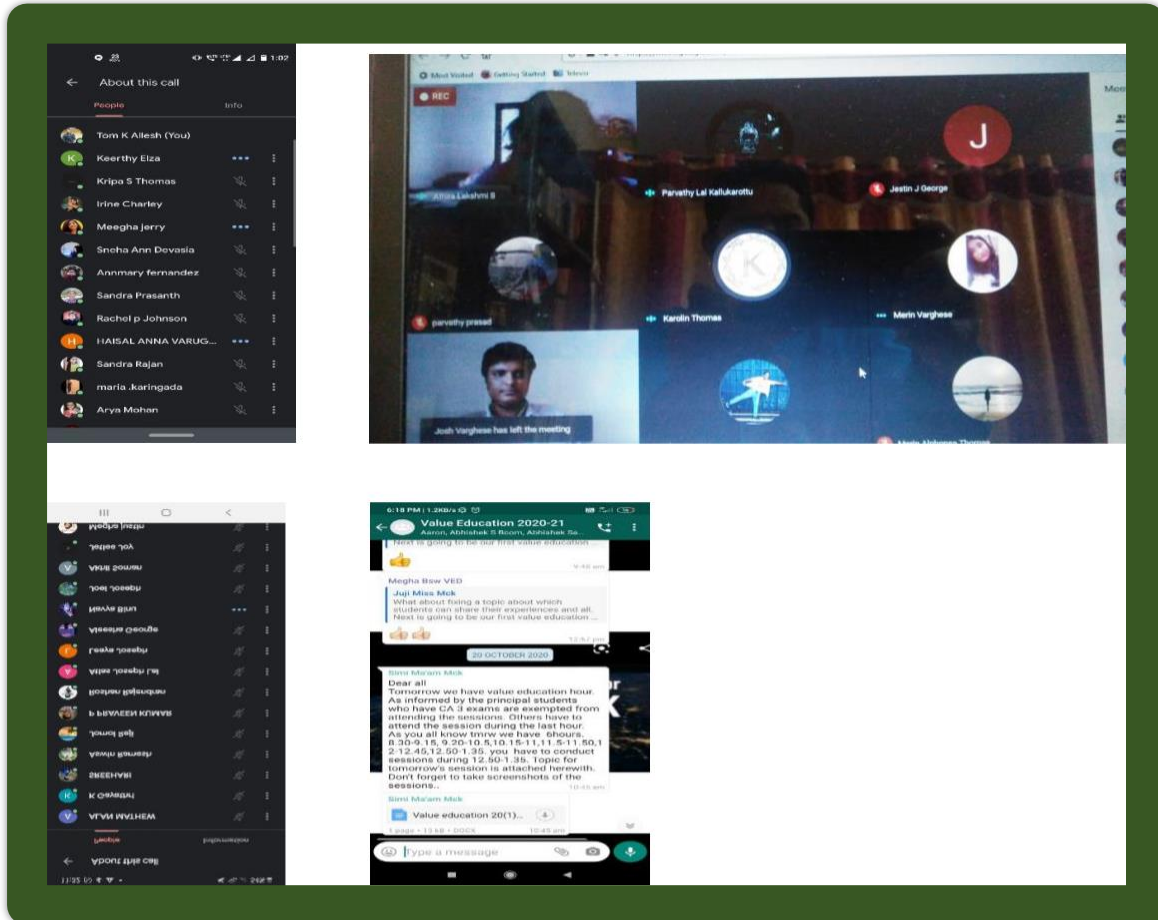

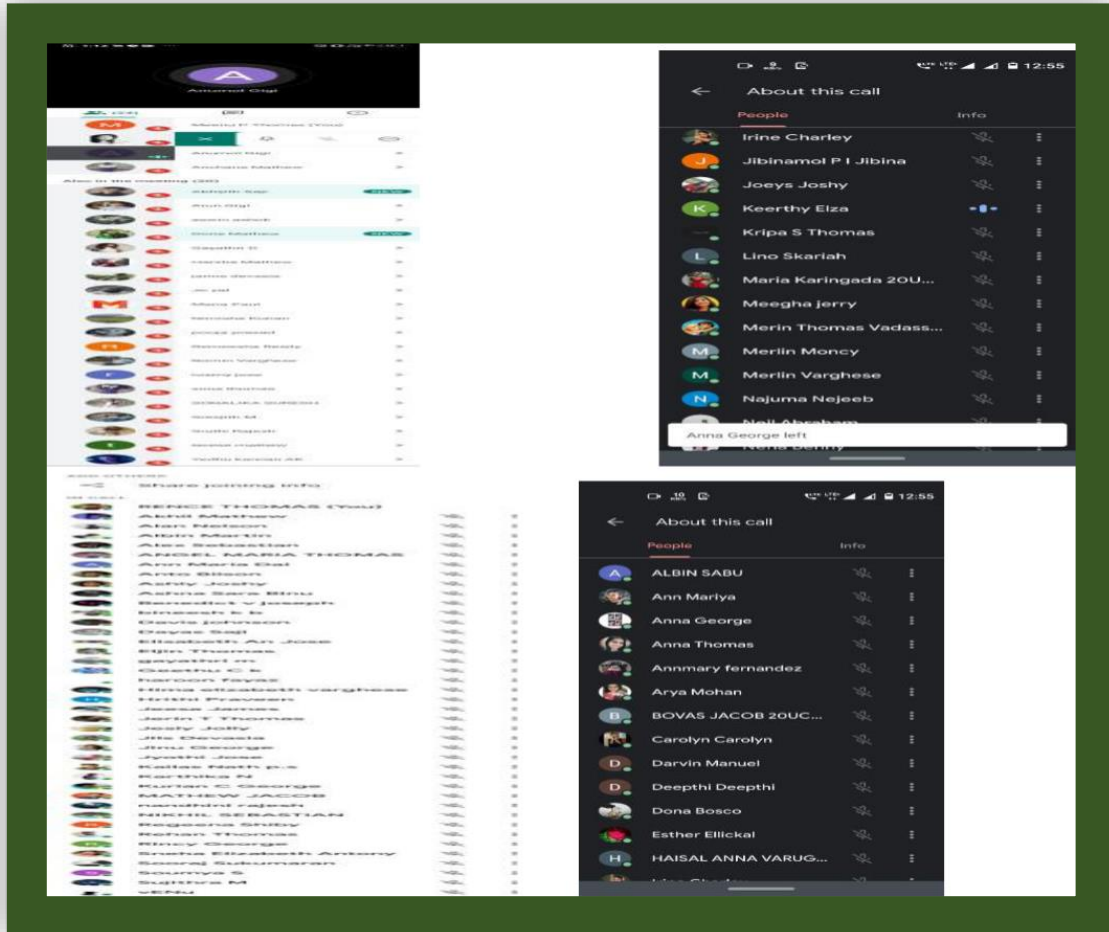

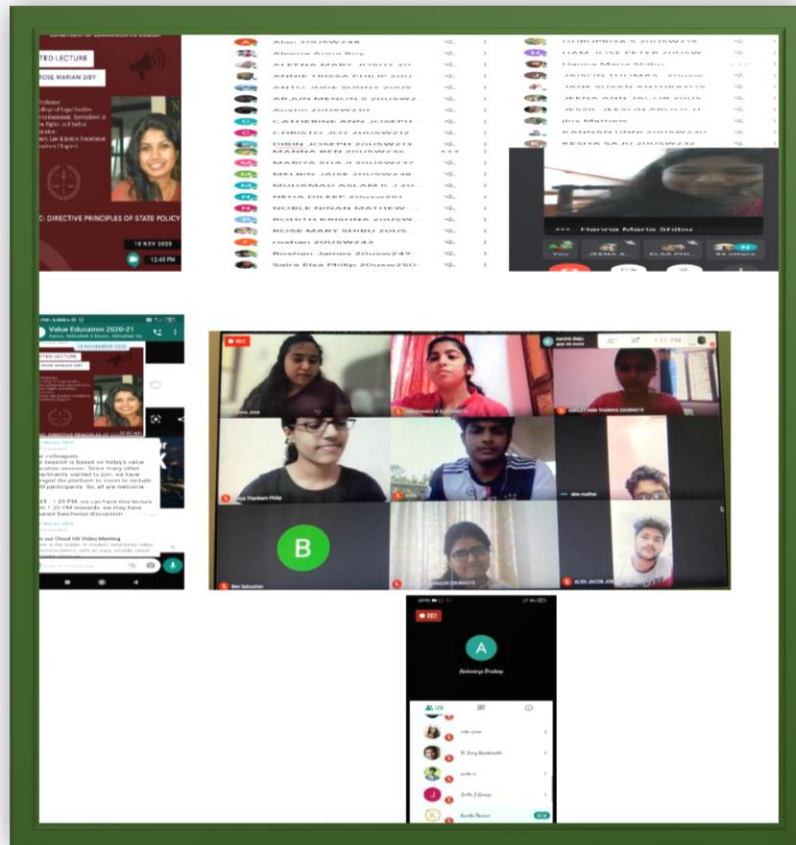


Value education session on Fundamental Duties

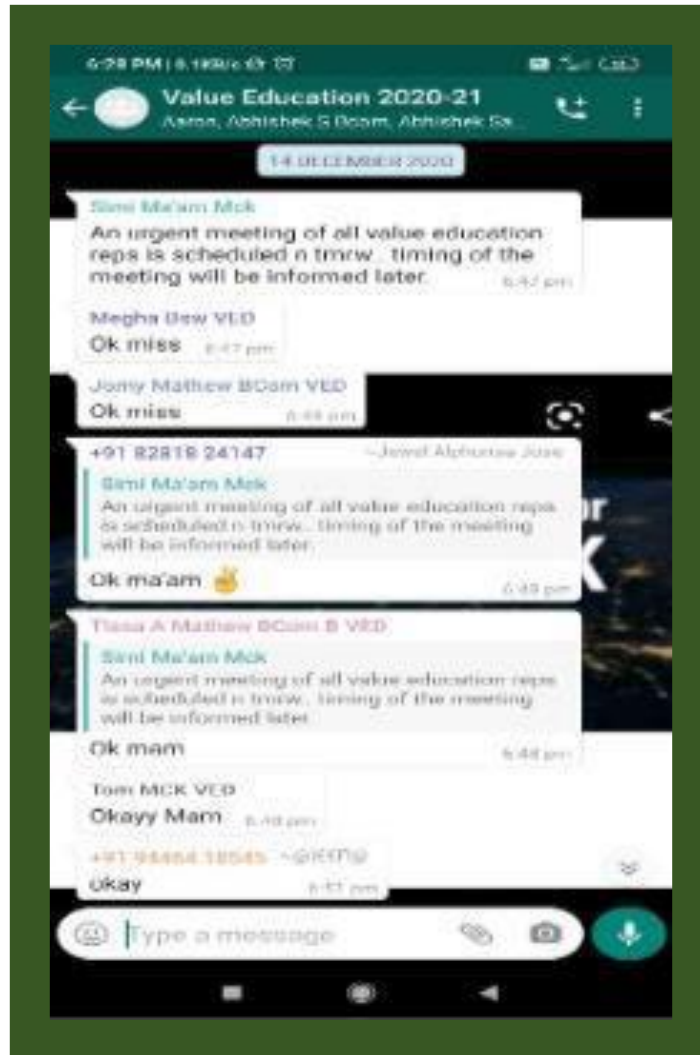

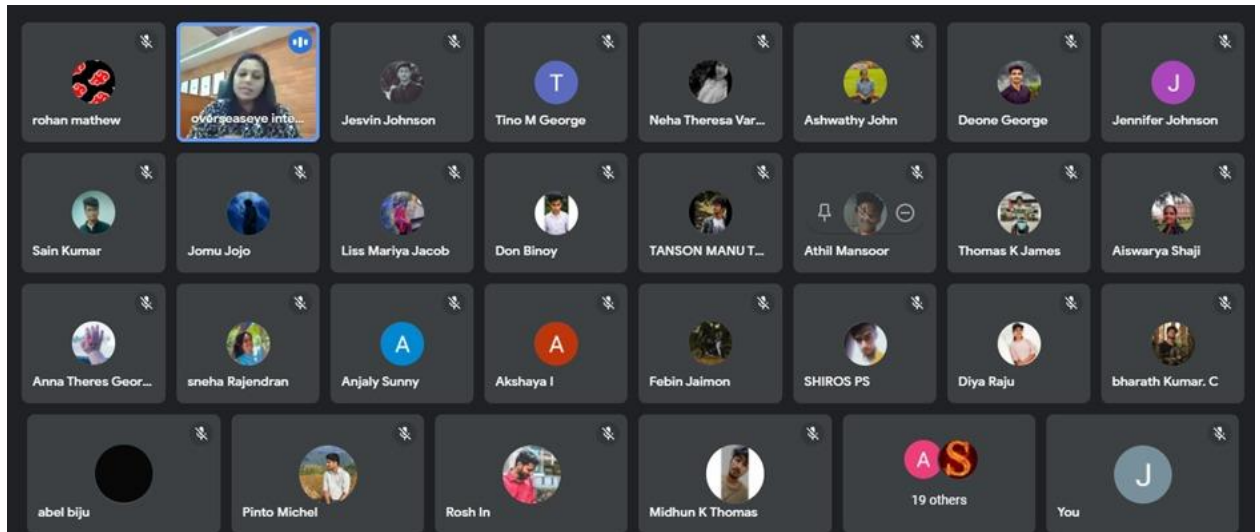

Value education program on “Awareness on prevention of cancer and healthy lifestyle”



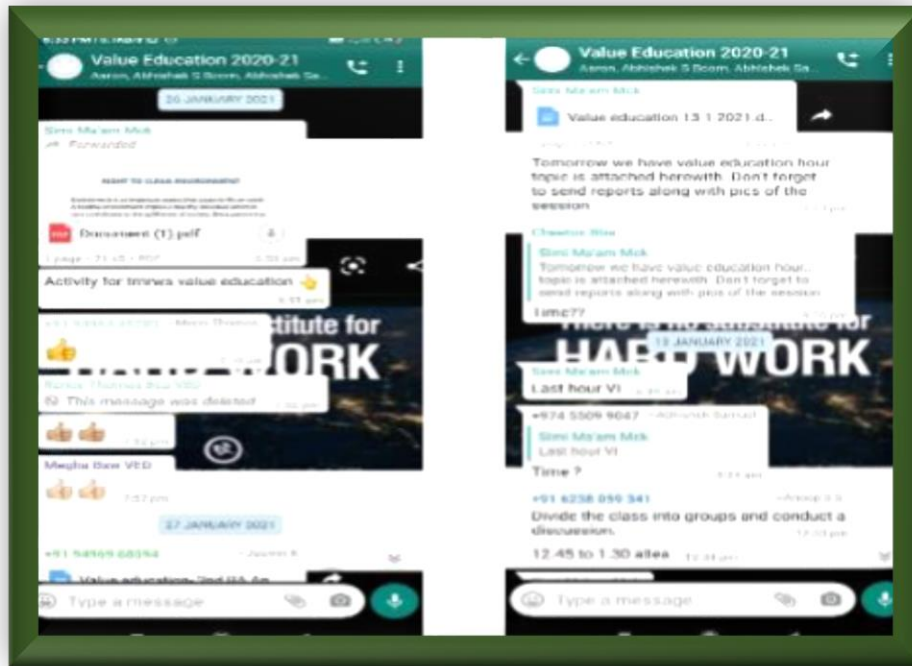
